Gas Furnace/Air Conditioner

- 1. Clean and adjust automatic controls
- 2. Clean burners
- 3. Adjust combustion for optimum fuel efficiency
- 4. Lubricate as needed
- 5. Test for combustion leaks
- 6. Test safety shutoff response
- 7. Check blower belt wear, tension & alignment
- 8. Check flue for satisfactory operation
- 9. Check condensor coil if necessary
- 10. Check electrical connections for tightness

- 11. Adjust system for optimum cooling
- 12. Check for oil & refrigerant leaks
- 13. Check safety devices
- 14. Check blower belt wear, tension & alignment
- 15. Check expansion valve & coil temperatures
- Check refrigerant level
- 17. Check condensate drain
- 18. Lubricate as needed
- 19. Replace 1" filter

Heat Pump

- 1. Lubricate as needed
- Check defrost cycle & reversing valve operation
- 3. Adjust air volume for maximum efficiency
- 4. Check safety devices and electrical connections for tightness
- 5. Check blower belt wear, tension & alignment
- 6. Check for oil & refrigerant leaks
- 7. Test electrical controls for proper operation
- 8. Check refrigerant level
- Check refrigerant controls & coil temperature for maximum efficiency
- 10. Check condensate drain

Gas Boiler

- 1. Lubricate pumps and motors
- 2. Clean burners
- 3. Adjust combustion for best efficiency
- 4. Test low-water cutoff
- 5. Test safety limit controls
- 6. Test safety shutoff response
- 7. Check water fill valve & expansion tank operation & setpoint
- 8. Test flue for satisfactory operation
- 9. Test for combustion leaks
- 10. Check for carbon monoxide
- 11. Check for proper water circulation

Conditions:

We agree to:

- 1. Inspect the equipment on a scheduled basis as shown, and during each inspection perform the applicable services per above checklist.
- 2. Instruct you in the operation of the equipment.
- Give our service contract holders preference over all service activity normally undertaken by us.

You agree to:

- 1. Operate the equipment according to our instructions.
- 2. Promptly notify us of any unusual operating conditions of the equipment.
- Permit only our service personnel and/or a service organization authorized by the US to work on the equipment.

General:

During the term of the agreement, we will take all reasonable precautions to avoid injury to persons and damage to property while on the premises, but we shall not be liable for any special or consequential damages.

We shall not be liable for losses or defect arising out of vandalism, fire, flood, wind, war, riots, or acts of God. In such cases, the customer shall be charged for the parts and labor involved at the then current price for such repairs. No such parts of labor shall be furnished, however, without authorization from the customer.

Gas Furnace/Air Conditioner Owner Checklist

- 1. Be sure thermostat is set on "Heat" or "Cool" as needed, and set properly.
- 2. Check all switches, fuses, and circuit breakers to be sure there is electricity to the unit.
- 3. Check filters to be sure they are not clogged.
- 4. Be sure the gas is on.
